ANNUAL REPORT FROM THE BOARD



2023: a review

Students

- In 2023, the foundation provided 25 students with financial support in relation to their medical training in Beira, Mozambique.
- No students dropped out in 2023. •
- No new scholarship students were accepted in 2023. •
- 8 students qualified in 2023. •

Finances

- The 2023 net operating result was negative at € -16,558 (budget: € -7,808).
- A charity lunch was held in October 2023. The proceeds amounted to € 3,400. •
- The doctors who have already qualified via DfM started paying back their scholarship money. The agreement made with all our students is that once they have gualified, they pay back to the foundation a total of 50% of the tuition fees paid on their behalf by the foundation, in instalments.
- Apesmo: Further steps were made by our subsidiary, Apesmo. Apesmo is gradually taking over more and more tasks from the Doctors for Mozambique Foundation (based in the Netherlands).

Activities

Gitta and Harrie visited Beira twice in 2023. Apesmo enrolled new students with the university, found them accommodation and opened a bank account for them. Apesmo also held its annual general meeting.





A look ahead to 2024

8 new students will be admitted to our programme in 2024 thanks to the receipt of a substantial new multi-year commitment.

We expect 4 medical students to qualify in 2024.

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ACCOUNTING PRINCIPLES

General

The annual accounts are compiled on the basis of historical cost. Unless stated otherwise at the top of the relevant balance sheet heading, assets and liabilities are included at nominal value.

Accounting principles applicable to the valuation of assets and liabilities

Receivables

The receivables are recorded at nominal value.

Liquid assets

Unless specifically stated otherwise, the liquid assets are at the free disposal of the foundation.

Short-term liabilities

The short-term liabilities are recorded at their nominal value.

Principles applicable to the determination of results

The results are determined as the difference between total income and total expenditure. Income is accounted for in the year in which it is realized, and expenditure as soon as it is foreseeable.

Withdrawals from and transfers to the appropriated reserve are charged to / added to the general reserve.

Income from donations from sponsors/events

Income from donations from sponsors/events is understood to mean gifts, contributions and proceeds received from third parties or promised for the accounting year in question.

Monies received in the context of multi-year commitments from companies and private individuals to make donations, whether or not these are linked to the training of one or more specific students, are accounted for as structural donations from sponsors. The total sum of structural donations received was lower than budgeted as a result of a downward trend in multi-year commitments from companies in particular in recent years. The foundation did receive a number of fantastic one-off legacy gifts in 2022.

A successful charity lunch was held in October 2023.

In 2023, we paid tuition fees for 18 students at the University of Beira in Mozambique. These amounted to a total of \notin 17,619. Tuition fees for new students and students who have fallen behind on their studies are paid pro rata. The amount spent on tuition fees in 2023 was significantly lower than in 2022 due to the extension of the end of the academic year as a result of Covid-19. In 2022, the tuition fees for the second semester of 2021 were paid in addition to those for the first and second semesters of 2022.

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In 2023, the foundation paid a monthly contribution to the living expenses of 25 students. In 2023, the monthly contribution per student was \in 85 (2022: also \in 85).

Supervision of students

The foundation pays a contribution to the University of Beira for the local supervision of students. In addition, the foundation also employs the services of a local supervisor, Mauane Manuel. He is the students' first point of contact, and he keeps a close eye on their development. He reports to Gitta van der Meeren, and indirectly to the Board.

General expenses

Once again, the Board was able to keep general expenses very low. These expenses represented 1.6% (amount in Euros: € 505) of income (in 2022: 1.2%, amount in Euros: € 528). The members of the Board and other workers do not receive any remuneration for their work/services.
